About the Creamery...

The Creamery Arts Center is the home of the Springfield Regional Arts Council, Springfield Regional Opera, Springfield Ballet, Springfield Symphony, An Arts Patronage Initiative and the Springfield Community Center office.

The Creamery houses an Art Exhibition Gallery, Arts Library, Arts Classrooms, film-editing bays, 3 ballet studios, a costume storage and design shop and a set design/fabrication studio.

The Creamery serves as an education center with hands-on children's programs and literary, performing and visual arts workshops for all age groups. The gallery may be reserved for private events.
